Chairman's Report May 2025

Another busy year for the Wychwoods Local History Society with nine talks, two-fêtes, and a visit to North Leigh Roman villa. The main event of last year was the 150th anniversary of the Cospatrick disaster in

November 1874. The archive team produced a very impressive booklet on emigration and explaining why people from this area took such a hazardous journey. The booklet is free to members.

Three walking trails have been produced, the last of which is the Ascott Trail produced by TASC (The Arts Society Cotswolds) - with the WLHS providing consultation on history matters. This is the third trail (Milton and Shipton trails were put together in previous years) produced by TASC with input from the WLHS. The WLHS also provided the



local heritage notes for the Milton-under-Wychwood "Standing Stones Trail" - The concept for the Trail being designed by Julia Sorrell and executed by Milton PC with section 106 funds.

The library exhibitions in 2024 -25 included: Cricket; Fetes and Festivities; Harvest and Farming; The Cospatrick; Football and (currently) Childhood Memories. Many of these pictures contain photos of people, known and unknown, that the team would like members of the public to identify.

Events. We attended two very successful fétes with photo displays in the summer in Milton and Shipton with a great deal of interest shown in the story of the Cospatrick. As part of Cospatrick commemorations the Archive team contributed to the Oxfordshire Local History Study Day on Emigration held in Burford in November. We also participated in Local and Family History afternoon in Ascott. Also, members of the committee attended, by invitation, the Annual Parish meetings of Ascott, Shipton and Milton, and outlined our work to the Shipton WI.

Archive. Having a central office in Groves has meant that we can continue the work of cataloguing and management of the extensive archive. We are also receiving more archive material from other sources. To this end, we would like to invite volunteers who would be willing to assist in the task of cataloguing. We are happy to welcome small groups of members who would like to visit the archive. For more information, please contact Carol, John or David.
